Introduction

This Cookie Policy explains how **CodeForgeX Studio** (“Company,” “we,” “us,” or “our”) uses cookies and similar technologies to recognize you when you visit our website at <https://codeforgex.studio> (the “Website”). It explains what these technologies are, why we use them, and how you can control our use of them.

In some cases, we may use cookies to collect personal information, or information that becomes personal information when combined with other data.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. They are widely used by website owners to make their websites work, to work more efficiently, and to provide reporting information.

Cookies set by the Website owner (in this case, **CodeForgeX Studio**) are called **first-party cookies**.

Cookies set by parties other than the Website owner are called **third-party cookies**. Third-party cookies enable third-party features or functionality to be provided on or through the Website (for example, advertising, interactive content, and analytics). The parties that set these third-party cookies can recognize your device both when it visits the Website and when it visits certain other websites.

Why do we use cookies?

We use first-party and third-party cookies for several reasons. Some cookies are required for technical reasons in order for our Website to operate, and we refer to these as **essential** or **strictly necessary** cookies.

Other cookies enable us to:

- Enhance and personalize your experience on the Website.
- Understand how our Website is being used and improve performance.
- Analyze traffic and usage patterns.
- Provide, secure, and maintain our services.

Third parties may serve cookies through our Website for advertising, analytics, and other purposes, as described in the sections below.

How can I control cookies?

You have the right to decide whether to accept or reject cookies that are not strictly necessary. You can exercise your cookie preferences through:

- A cookie consent banner or manager on our Website (where available).
- Your browser settings, as described in the **How can I control cookies in my browser?** section below.

Essential cookies cannot be rejected, as they are strictly necessary to provide you with the services and features of the Website. If you choose to reject non-essential cookies, you may still use our Website, but some features and areas of the Website may be limited or may not function correctly.

If we provide a Cookie Consent Manager on the Website, it will allow you to accept or refuse non-essential cookie categories and to change or withdraw your consent at any time.

Types of cookies we use

The specific cookies used on the Website may vary over time as we update or change our services, but in general we use the following categories of cookies:

Essential (strictly necessary) cookies

- Required for the Website to function properly.
- Enable core features such as page navigation, secure login, and form submission.
- Without these cookies, the Website cannot perform basic functions.

Performance and analytics cookies

- Help us understand how visitors use the Website.
- Collect information such as pages visited, time spent on pages, and error messages.
- Used to improve the performance and usability of the Website.

Functionality cookies

- Allow the Website to remember choices you make (such as language preferences or region).
- Provide enhanced and more personalized features.

Advertising and targeting cookies

- Used to deliver advertising that is more relevant to you and your interests.
- Limit how often you see an advertisement and help measure the effectiveness of ad campaigns.
- May be placed by us or by third-party advertising networks.

Social media cookies

- Used when you share content from our Website on social media platforms or use social login features.
- These cookies may track your browser across other sites and build a profile of your interests.

If required, we may provide a separate cookie table on the Website listing individual cookies, their providers, duration, and purposes.

How can I control cookies in my browser?

The means by which you can refuse cookies through your web browser controls vary from browser to browser. You should visit your browser's help menu for more information. The following links provide guidance on managing cookies in popular browsers:

Other tracking technologies (web beacons, pixels, etc.)

Cookies are not the only way to recognize or track visitors to a website. We may also use similar technologies from time to time, such as **web beacons** (also known as tracking pixels or clear gifs). These are tiny graphics files that contain a unique identifier that enables us to recognize when someone has visited our Website or opened an email that includes them.

These technologies allow us to, for example:

- Monitor traffic patterns from one page within the Website to another.
- Measure and improve the performance of the Website and campaigns.
- Understand whether you have come to the Website from an online advertisement on a third-party site.

In many cases, these technologies rely on cookies to function properly, so declining cookies may impair the functioning of some of these features.

Flash cookies and Local Shared Objects

Our Website may also use "Flash Cookies" (also known as Local Shared Objects or "LSOs") to collect and store information about your use of our services, support fraud prevention, and assist with other site operations.

If you do not want Flash Cookies stored on your computer, you can adjust the settings of your Flash Player using the **Website Storage Settings Panel** and the **Global Storage Settings Panel** provided by Adobe. Limiting Flash Cookies may reduce or impair the functionality of some Flash applications, including those used in connection with our services or online content.

Targeted advertising

Third parties may serve cookies on your computer or mobile device to deliver advertising through our Website. These companies may use information about your visits to this and other websites to provide relevant advertisements about goods and services that may interest you.

They may also use cookies or web beacons to:

- Measure the performance of advertising campaigns.
- Limit the number of times you see a particular advertisement.
- Understand user behavior across websites.

The information collected in this way does not typically enable us or them to identify you directly (such as by name or email address), unless you choose to provide such details.

We may update this Cookie Policy from time to time to reflect changes to the cookies we use or for other operational, legal, or regulatory reasons. When we make changes, we will update the "Last updated" date at the top of this Cookie Policy.
